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
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Problems Encountered and Resources Required

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CONTENT BEYOND THE SYLLABUS

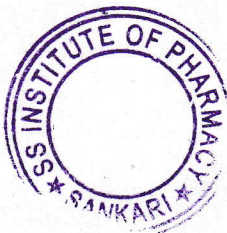



Through these initiatives, our SS Institute of Pharmacy ensures that its students are not only academically sound but also professionally competent and future-ready.




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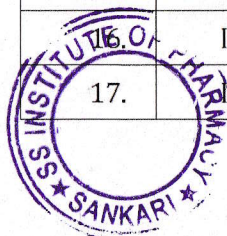
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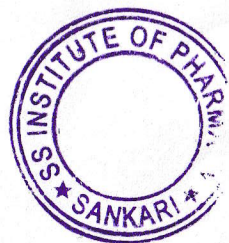

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BEST PRACTICE 2: SOCIAL AWARENESS AND UPLIFTMENT CAMPAIGN

In our SS Institute of Pharmacy, outreach activities are viewed not only as a service but also as a learning opportunity that complements classroom instruction with real-world experiences. Outreach activities are an essential component of higher education, particularly in institutions offering professional courses like pharmacy.

These activities act as a bridge between academic knowledge and societal needs, fostering a sense of responsibility among students and strengthening the institution's role in community development. The institute has consistently organized a range of outreach programs with the aim of promoting health awareness, enhancing access to pharmaceutical care, supporting underprivileged communities, and contributing to the overall well-being of society. This report presents a comprehensive overview of the various outreach initiatives conducted by the institute over the years, reflecting its commitment to social responsibility and holistic education.

1. Health Awareness Camps

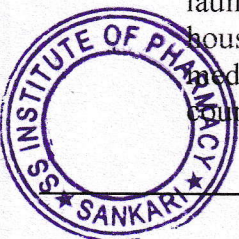
One of the key outreach initiatives undertaken by our SS Institute of Pharmacy is the organization of health awareness camps in rural areas. These camps are aimed at educating the public on common health issues, promoting healthy lifestyles, and encouraging preventive healthcare practices.

Our Institute collaborated with a local Primary Health Centre to conduct a Free Health Check-up and Awareness Camp in the village of Kidaiyur. Faculty members, along with students, participated actively in every camp. Services provided included blood pressure and blood sugar testing, and counselling sessions on managing lifestyle diseases such as diabetes and hypertension. More than 300 villagers availed themselves of these services.

Additionally, pamphlets were distributed, and short lectures were given on topics such as personal hygiene, nutrition, the importance of vaccination, and safe use of medications. The response from the local community was overwhelmingly positive, and feedback indicated a strong desire for more such camps in the future.

2. Pharmacy Practice Outreach

In alignment with the institution's mission to promote rational drug use, we have launched a Drug Information Campaign. Students visited local pharmacies, clinics, and households to spread awareness about the correct usage of over-the-counter (OTC) medications, the dangers of self-medication, and the importance of completing prescribed courses of antibiotics.



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This initiative not only educated the public but also provided students with practical exposure to community pharmacy settings. Students prepared and distributed information leaflets in Tamil and English, and participated in interactive Q&A sessions with residents. The campaign also emphasized the identification and disposal of expired medicines to reduce the risk of accidental poisoning.

3. School Health Program

As part of its outreach to younger populations, our institute organized a School Health Education Program. The program targeted government schools in the surrounding areas, with the goal of educating students about hygiene, nutrition, and substance abuse prevention. Faculty and student volunteers conducted interactive sessions using models, posters, and audiovisual aids. Children were taught the importance of hand washing, brushing teeth, balanced diets, and avoiding junk food. Sessions on the dangers of smoking, alcohol, and drug use were handled with age-appropriate sensitivity.

A total of nearly 150 students were get benefits through sharing knowledge, Teachers appreciated the program and expressed interest in making it an annual event. The initiative reinforced the importance of early health education and its long-term impact on community wellness.

4. Blood Donation Drive

Our SS Institute of Pharmacy organized a Blood Donation Camp in our campus. The drive saw enthusiastic participation from students, staff, and local community members. A total of 112 units of blood were collected and donated to government hospitals in the district. Prior to the camp, awareness sessions were held to dispel myths about blood donation and highlight its significance in saving lives. Posters and banners were displayed throughout the campus to encourage participation.

5. Environmental Awareness and Cleanliness Drives

Recognizing the interconnection between health and the environment, our institute also undertook several environmental outreach activities. A Tree Plantation Drive was organized in our institute Over 200 saplings were planted in and around the institute premises and nearby public areas.

Additionally, students conducted a Swachh Bharat Abhiyan Cleanliness Drive in neighbouring communities, clearing garbage, educating households on waste segregation, and promoting eco-friendly practices such as composting and reduced plastic use. These activities fostered environmental consciousness and social responsibility among students.

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6. COVID-19 Awareness and Vaccination Support

Although the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic has passed, vaccine hesitancy and misinformation remain challenges in many rural areas. Our institute launched a COVID Awareness and Vaccination Support Program. Students assisted local health workers in educating the public about the benefits of COVID-19 boosters and supported logistics during rural vaccination drives.

Informative sessions were held on COVID complications, mental health, and nutritional rehabilitation. This initiative was crucial in dispelling myths, especially among the elderly and marginalized populations, and demonstrated the role of pharmacy professionals in pandemic response and recovery.

A special outreach activity focusing on women's health and menstrual hygiene was organised and conducted by our institute. Female faculty and students led sessions for women in local communities on reproductive health, safe motherhood, and the use of sanitary products.

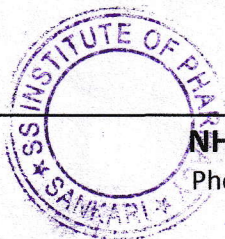
Impact and Feedback

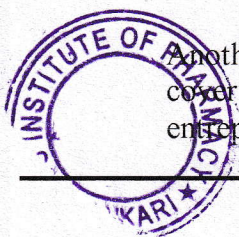
Context

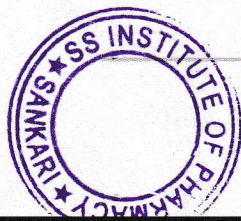

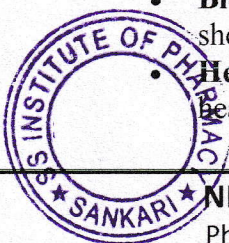
3. The Context

- **Cultural Awareness Events:** The Rotaract Club hosts inter-cultural celebrations to foster inclusion and unity.


These practices are embedded in the academic calendar and supervised by faculty coordinators to ensure sustainability, accountability, and impact measurement.

- Enhanced soft skills, leadership qualities, and social sensitivity as observed through feedback and alumni testimonials.

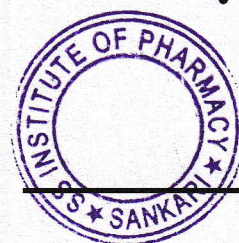
6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

 - Faculty mentorship and peer leadership development programs.


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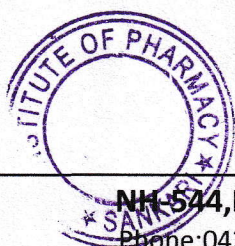
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Conclusion
